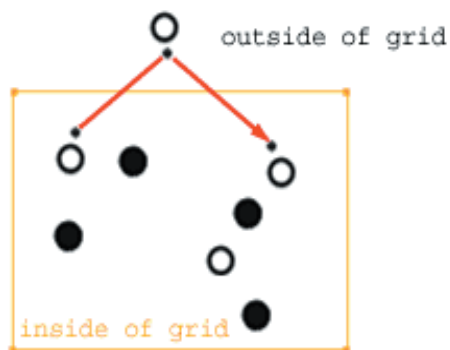

COACH TALK

Defensive Drills - GROUP DEFENDING

Description: Two squads of players start in a confined rectangular area or grid. Basically, both teams are playing keepaway with the exception that the team in possession of the ball is allowed to leave the predefined zone. To keep things even, if an attacker receives the ball outside of the box, he must play it back into the zone with one touch (two touches for younger players.)



Task: keep possession of the ball by knocking it in and out of the grid; the team without the ball must stay inside of the box; players outside of the grid can only play it back in with one touch (or two, one for controlling and one for passing)

Purpose: compact group defending

Complexity: complex

Explanation: This drill encompasses many features of real match situations and forces the players to work in conjunction. Compactness is the major principle of playing group defense. In the drill, the defending team is required to compress inside the box (forcing the opposition out.) The attackers have no choice but to spread outside of the grid. Young players may have trouble understanding the importance of spreading out in attack. To stimulate them, you can enforce an additional rule demanding that at least one attacker has to stay outside of the box at all times.

Score: 2-1 (won) It was obvious after only a few minutes that we were a much better team than our opponents. Immediately from the kick off we dominated ball possession and field position. In spite of this, we made a careless defensive error and conceded a goal against the run of play to go 1 nil down. We have done this in our last three games, so it is becoming a habit we can do without. I knew that we would come back and win, but I didn't expect it to take so long, and I was surprised that it was in the form of two great headers from Youssef and then Andrew Raad. Congratulations guys on coming back from behind. Just remember that if it happens again in the future, we are capable of winning even when we concede the lead. However, there are still several aspects of our play that need to be improved. The 46 unforced errors we made last week were nothing compared to our error rate in this game. It must have approached 100. It all gets back to players making very poor decisions. Trying to dribble around an opponent when there is a team mate in a good position waiting for a pass, is simply selfish and stupid. Many times an error occurred when players opted not to pass back but decided to hold on to the ball and go forward. In most cases the ball was lost. At training we are going to continue to work on playing in triangles, back passing, holding position and running off the ball. All drills will be aimed at achieving this. We have Burwood in our next game. I would think that there is no greater motivating factor to improve than this.

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U/17-1 vs Hurlstone Park (late round 3 report)

Score: 3-1 (won) Our finishing in this game was awful and not up to the standard required to win the competition. With our obvious advantage in speed and technical ability, we should have won by a far greater margin than we did. We recorded statistics for this game, which revealed that we made 46 unforced errors. This indicates quite clearly how much scope for improvement there is. One positive statistic was that we made a combined total of 81 square and back passes, an aspect that we worked on at training. On the other hand, our inability to keep our shape and to hold positions was a major disappointment again. We discussed this at training but did not produce it in this game. Unless we perfect the holding midfield role, we will struggle to beat teams as easily as we should. I must say that I was absolutely thrilled with the way Christian played. He has improved his game by using his body very effectively to block the ball when he is in a one on one contest. He won nearly every one of these contests, showing that you don't need to be the biggest nor the fastest player to dominate. He applied his skill and determination throughout the whole 80 minutes. Well done Christian! As I said to all of you after the game, I am not disappointed with the level of effort, I am just not happy with the poor decisions that are made by individuals. I have tried to emphasise over the years, that when playing soccer two thoughts should dominate your mind. Make a good pass and then make sure I am holding my position in relation to the rest of my team mates. Let the strikers take on defenders and shoot. If you are a defender, always get behind the ball. If you are a midfielder, your job is to feed good balls to your attackers. Let's make progress in the next game!
