COACH TALK

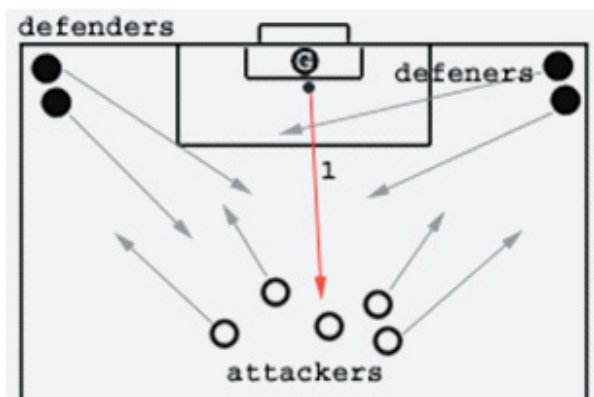
Shooting Drills - Standard 5v4 Attack

Description: The keeper boots the ball at a "pack" of attackers gathered close to each other. The attackers are allowed to break up immediately after the punted ball lands. Simultaneously, four defenders (starting by twos at the corner flags) enter the pitch trying to gain possession and complete 7-10 passes. Inversely, the attackers are required to score before making 7-10 passes.

Task: for the attackers - finish before executing 7-10 passes;
for the defenders - gain possession and make 7-10 passes

Purpose: direct attacks, group play

Complexity: complex



Explanation: This drill provides a good introduction to the overall concepts of defense and offense. The attackers are required to spread out whereas the defenders must maintain a compact shape.

So two defensive errors result in two goals against us. However the defense played really well and can hold their heads high for these were about the only errors made. In attack we made more errors, the main ones repeated often were that we took too many touches and didn't have a shot on goal often enough because we wanted too much time to prepare! We had a few shots on goal when we were in position to have 20. Mind you the shot by Hussein to get our goal was an absolute cracker. He equalised within 60 seconds of conceding the first goal. We need to understand that these attacking errors cost us more than the defensive errors. If we had 20 shots on target, chances are that we would have scored at least 3 or 4 goals and won the match. Any team that doesn't score goals puts its defense under enormous pressure to not concede a goal and then any error in defense is potentially a tragedy. This is what happened to us. We do have the ability if we can just harness the willpower and discipline better. Have lots of shots and have them sooner. We didn't deserve to lose that match but will have to learn from it, that was one that got away. The team played really well and in that form can finish the season's last 3 games with 3 wins. It may not be enough to get us into the semis but it will put pressure on those above us not to slip. I know Marrickville will be glad if we do not make it because they were rattled by us today!
